

CORRYMORE LAKE

This lovely lake (Lough Acorrymore), a glacial corry lake formed during the last ice age, was the site of Mrs McCormick's cottage and location of one of the tragedies in the movie.

Slievemore was the location for exterior and some interior Mass scenes. It is an active Church of Ireland building and not open to the public outside of services. When visiting please be respectful of the graves within the grounds

KEEM BEACH

Beautiful Blue Flag Keem Beach was the location of Colm Doherty's cottage and the setting for many of the beach scenes, including the final scene of the film. The building used in the movie is private and not open to the public.



THE HARBOUR

Purteen harbour was transformed into a portside street scene complete with Post Office and shop. The shop building - O'Riordan's - was constructed entirely for the movie and the row of cottages was a facade erected in front of existing fishermen's buildings.



THE STATUE

A few hundred metres from the site of Jonjo's pub is the location of a fictional fork in the road, where a statue of the Virgin Mary stood in the movie. The statue was a film prop, and the road doesn't fork - the short path created for the film leads straight to a cliff edge. This location was the setting for several road scenes, including Pádraic's daily walk with Jenny the Donkey and the cart journey as Colm brings Padraic home after a beating in the village.





THE PUB

more was the dramatic cliffside setting for JJ Devine's (Jonjo's pub) constructed, complete with working bar, by the film crew. The building was dismantled after filming, leaving this local beauty spot with views across Clew Bay in its natural state. It is the location for the publicity photo from the movie showing Colin Farrell (Pádraic) and Brendan Colm) talking at a vooden table outside.
